Eligibility and Criteria

Grantees for the 2024 Summer cohort must adhere to the following criteria to receive the \$5,000 grant from IEHP Foundation:

- 501(c)(3) nonprofit or community-based organization (CBO).
- Must have an annual operating budget of \$500,000 or less.
- The organization's leader (CEO, President, Executive Director, etc.) must complete the 5-week educational program.
