- CalKIDS: <u>CalKIDS</u> is a new program from the State of California that provides eligible families with free money for college. California <u>newborns</u> can receive up to \$175 and eligible California public school <u>students</u> can receive up to \$1,500. CalKIDS was created to help families kickstart their college savings plan and increase access to higher education. Families can check their eligibility and claim their account here: <u>Get Started | CalKIDS</u>.

- Transforming CA's Behavioral Health System: Last week, the Governor announced the state is accelerating in record time the first round of funding, made available by Prop 1! Eligible entities, which include counties and cities, will be able to apply for funding from the first round of the \$6.38B bond this summer. The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) has issued bond guidance for behavioral health treatment beds and sites, with the request for application to be posted this summer.
